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Indianapolis Air Show drops ticket prices for May 14, 15 – opportunity to see Blue Angels now even more affordable!

Adult, children's tickets both cut by \$5; save additional money by buying online beginning Feb. 1

(Indianapolis, Ind.) – [Indianapolis Air Show](http://www.indyairshow.com) organizers announced today that they are dropping the price of admission to the May 14 and 15 performances and exhibits at Mt. Comfort Airport.

The price of an adult ticket for Saturday or Sunday is now \$15 and children between six and 12 years old can get in for \$5 – both of these prices are \$5 less than last year.

During a Blue Angels demonstration, air show-goers can expect choreographed refinements of the skills possessed by these amazing naval aviators, including the graceful moves of the four-plane Diamond Formation, as well as the pinnacle of precision flying, the renowned, six-jet Delta Formation.
